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# Which Jesus Do Catholics Worship and Trust?

Roman Catholic friend recently told me he was a Christian because he loves Jesus. When I asked him to tell me about the Jesus he loves, he said "The same Jesus you love!" I realized we needed to make sure we were talking about the same Jesus. So I brought up the name of a mutual friend whom we both admired. I began describing some of his attributes by saying he is a short, bald, slender guy with a gorgeous girl friend. My Catholic friend stopped me and said "Wait a minute, he's tall and muscular with lots of hair and married; we're obviously *not* talking about the same person." When I asked: "Does it really matter?" he gave me a bewildered look, and said: "Of course it does!" I said: "Then it also matters that we talk about the same Jesus." We must know who He is, what He has done, what He is doing, what He offers, what He commands, what He promises, and what He warns us about.

What follows is a description of Jesus, as He is revealed in Scripture, contrasted with the Jesus whom Catholics have been taught to trust. The Lord Jesus, who is the *truth* can only be known in *truth* by those who seek the *truth* (2 Thes. 2:13).

#### Jesus Is Head of the Church

He is the head over all rule and authority (Col. 2:9). The Lord Jesus has sovereign authority over the church, over all physical and spiritual life, over death and creation, and over the eternal destiny of all people. He gives life to whom He wishes (John 5:21). The church is the body of Christ and Jesus is the only head.

Yet Catholics submit to another head - the Roman Pontiff, as Vicar of Christ, he is said

to be the pastor of the entire Church. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), the pope "has full, supreme, and universal power over the whole Church, a power which he can always exercise unhindered" (CCC, paragraph <u>882</u>).

#### Jesus Is The Only Savior

Peter declared: "There is salvation in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men, by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12). The Psalmist wrote: "No man can by any means redeem his brother, or give to God a ransom for him. For the redemption of his soul is costly, and he should cease trying forever" (Psalm 49:7-8).

Yet Catholics deny Jesus is the *only* hope of their salvation. "In the treasury, too, are the prayers and good works of all the saints...In this way *they attained their own salvation* and at the same time cooperated in saving their brothers" (CCC, <u>1477</u>). John Paul said, "All who seek God...including those who do not know Christ will enter God's kingdom" (VIS, 12/6/00). The Catholic plan of salvation also includes the Muslims who deny Jesus is God and Savior (CCC, <u>841</u>).

#### **Jesus Saves Forever**

The Scriptures declare that Jesus "is able to save forever those who draw near to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them" (Heb. 7:25). To those God justifies, Jesus promises: He will lose not one (Jn. 6:39); He will not cast them out (6:37) and they will never perish (Jn. 10:28).

The Catholic Jesus does not save forever.
The Catechism teaches that a Catholic, once

"justified" by the sacrament of baptism, who dies in a state of mortal sin, will suffer the punishments of hell's eternal fire (CCC, 1035). The Catholic Jesus provides only conditional life. After the sacrament of baptism each Catholic is placed on probation and must strive to remain in God's favor. This produces uncertainty, fear and doubt instead of the peace and assurance given to believers.

#### **Jesus Paid Sin's Complete Penalty**

The Lord Jesus went to the cross for all believers for the purpose of forgiving all our transgressions and canceling out the certificate of debt consisting of decrees against us. He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross (Col. 2:13-14). The redemption of a sinner's soul requires an *infinite* payment because the debt for sin is the *eternal* lake of fire (Rev. 20:14). It is utterly impossible for a finite man to pay an infinite debt. Only the eternal God could pay the eternal debt for sin. Jesus paid it in full.

Again we see another Jesus in Catholicism, a Jesus who failed to cancel the sin debt. As a result, the sinner must...do penance to make amends for his sin: he must "make satisfaction for" or "expiate" his sins (CCC, 1459). Catholics can also obtain indulgences, which are said to remit temporal punishment, for themselves or for the dead (CCC, 1471).

#### Jesus Shed His Blood to Purify Sin

The Bible teaches that the blood of Jesus cleanses us from all sin (1 John 1:7). When He had made purification of sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high (Hebrews 1:3). There is no other way our sins can be purged away because "without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness" (Heb. 9:22).

Rather than trusting the blood of Christ, Catholics rely on fire for the purification of their sins. Instead of trusting the *person* of Christ they trust a *place* called purgatory. "All who die...imperfectly purified...undergo purification (through a purifying fire), so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (CCC, 1030-31).

#### Jesus Finished His Redeeming Work

Moments before He gave up His Spirit He proclaimed, "It is finished" (John 19:30). Three days later He entered heaven having obtained eternal redemption (Heb. 9:12).

From Scripture we know Jesus offered Himself once to bear sins (<u>Heb. 10:28</u>) His offering is not to be done again and again (<u>Heb. 9:25</u>). His offering made perfect forever those who are sanctified (<u>Heb. 10:14</u>). His offering is sufficient; there is no more offering for sin (Heb. 10:18).

Yet the Catholic Jesus is offered daily to continue that which Jesus said was finished! "The sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of the Eucharist are one single sacrifice: The victim is one and the same. In this divine sacrifice the same Christ who offered himself once in a bloody manner on the altar of the cross is contained and is offered in an unbloody manner." (1367) How can it be? The actual suffering and death of the genuine Jesus on a cross, which resulted in the shedding of real blood, failed to remit the complete punishment for sin, but a bloodless re-presentation of a "Jesus" in a transubstantiated wafer can? It is unconscionable that Catholics would want to participate in His ongoing immolation after He endured such unspeakable agony once to completely satisfy the divine justice sinners deserve. May God help Catholics to see they have been outrageously deceived!

### Jesus Redeemed Sinners from the Curse of the Law

Since it impossible for man to obey the law perfectly, we are all under a curse. Those who stumble at one point are guilty of breaking the whole Law (Jas 2:10). But Christ has redeemed believers from the curse of the law, having become a curse for them (Gal. 3:13).

The Roman Catholic Church teaches obedience to the law is a requirement for salvation (CCC, 2068). By ignoring the words of Paul "no one is justified by the Law" Catholics remain under the curse of the law (Gal. 3:11)

#### Jesus Will Return to Earth in Glory

Jesus shall appear a second time, **without reference to sin**, to those who eagerly await Him (Heb. 9:28). He will return immediately after the tribulation with power and great glory (Mat. 24:27-30). The Lord will return the same way He went to heaven (Acts 1:11).

The Catholic Jesus is said to return physically to the earth every day but in a totally different way and **in reference to sin.** In the Eucharist, "the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is

#### Protestant Pastors Converting to Rome

The Coming Home Network is a Roman Catholic society that furnishes moral and financial support to Protestant clergymen who are considering converting to Roman Catholicism. John Robbins of The Trinity Foundation (www.trinityfoundation.org) contacted the Network recently and asked them some questions about their activities. Following are the answers to his questions:

*JR*: How many Protestant clergymen are you presently working with?

CHN: Currently we have 839 ministers on our roles.

*JR*: How many Protestant clergymen have you helped to join the Roman Church? *CHN*: Of these 839 ministers, 483 are now in full communion with the Catholic Church.

*JR*: What are the trends: Are the numbers increasing?

CHN: Yes. We have had a 34% increase of non-catholic clergymen contacting us this years as compared to last year.

*JR*: Is there any denomination that predominates in conversions?

CHN: The two largest denominations are Episcopalian and Baptist.

Robbins' comment: If you have been hearing some strange sermons lately, you might want to ask your pastor if he is considering Rome and is in touch with *The Coming Home Network*. There are at least 350 clergymen out there who are.

While the movie has many "red flags" to be concerned about, it has also created an open forum to talk about Jesus. What a wonderful opportunity we have to boldly and clearly communicate the Gospel and, at the same time, refute and correct the errors of false religions and worldly philosophy. We must also contend for the faith against the false gospel of Catholicism being promoted by Mel Gibson and James Caviezel. They have been using interviews with the media and meetings with evangelical leaders to proselytize the world. Both have reported many conversions to Catholicism because of the film's impact. It is letters like yours that prompted me to write the article for this newsletter. If you placed no confidence in the flesh, you would be able to rejoice in Christ Jesus as your all-sufficient Savior (Phil. 3:3). But since you rely on your own ability and achievements to merit salvation through the power of your unredeemed flesh, you view Jesus, not as a Savior, but as a gate opener to heaven. You are correct - the Catholic Church accepts anyone, just as Constantine did in the 4th century. The ritual of baptism is the only requirement. However the true church of Jesus Christ accepts only those who have been washed by the blood of Jesus and have been imputed with His righteousness. You too can be a part of His church if you obey the first command of His earthly ministry: "Repent and believe the Gospel" (Mark 1:14-15).

First of all teachings "according to Gendron" or anyone else, for that matter, should be rejected unless they conform to God's word. Secondly, no one is saved by "accepting" Jesus. Salvation is given as a gift to those who "repent and believe the Gospel" (Mark 1:14-15). To repent is to have a change of mind upon discovering you are on the broad road to destruction. To believe the Gospel is to believe that God has accomplished everything in Christ that is necessary for a sinner to be 1) forgiven; 2) reconciled to God; 3) redeemed from the curse of the law; 4) adopted into His eternal family; 5) justified and acquitted; 6) saved from the power and punishment of

sin; and 7) made alive and sealed by His Spirit that guarantees an eternal inheritance. For someone who has experienced this sovereign act of God's grace to continue in sin is unthinkable and highly peculiar. The grace that brings salvation instructs us to deny ungodliness and worldly desires and to live sensibly, righteously and godly (Titus 2:12). Those God saves from the power of sin will demonstrate their love for Him as slaves of righteousness with heartfelt obedience to His word (Rom. 6:17-18). As they begin worshipping Him in Spirit and truth and living a life empowered by the Holy Spirit they will put to death the evil deeds of the flesh. If the child of God falls into temptation and sins, there is an advocate in heaven, the exalted Lord Jesus Christ who intercedes (1 John 2:1). You asked what happens in the unlikely case that he dies in the act of sin? I am as confident as Paul that God, who began a good work in him, will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus (Phil. 1:6). He will be brought into heaven to honor, worship, serve and glorify his Savior throughout all eternity.

I was given a copy of your article *Confus*ing, Complex Contradictions in Catholicism. It is sad that you spend so much time looking for contradictions. If you understood the Catholic Faith and the Eucharist, you would never have left the Faith. Are you sure you were once a "devout Catholic?" Really, it is hard to believe. When I read the citations that you quote as contradictory, I see a unity of thought - though a bit complex. Are you that simple-minded that you really don't understand these things? J.G., Washington

The "cause of unity concerns every believer, called to form part of the one people redeemed by the blood of Christ on the cross," he told the 4,000 people gathered in Paul VI Hall. "It is encouraging to see how the quest for unity among Christians is spreading increasingly," the Holy Father added. "Among these signs of hope I am pleased to note progress in theological dialogues with several Churches and ecclesial communities," he said. "It has been possible to come to convergences on topics which, in the past, were intensely controversial." (Zenit, 1/21/04)

## Southern Baptist Seeks Unity with Roman Catholics

A Southern Baptist theologian is encouraging evangelicals and Roman Catholics to "seek unity in truth." Dr. Timothy George is the dean of Beeson Divinity School at Samford University in Birmingham, Alabama. He is also one of the signers of "The Gift of Salvation," a document adopted by evangelical and Roman Catholic theologians in an effort to reaffirm the Reformation understanding of justification by faith alone. George says since the ecumenical statement was published in 1997, dialogue between the two religious groups has yielded progress. "We have a common source in St. Agustine, to start with, who is called the 'doctor of grace' or the 'teacher of grace' in the early Church, and of course, beyond Agustine, in St. Paul and the New Testament and the Holy Scriptures," George explains. "That's what Reformation theology is really all about; it's recovering the pure teaching of Holy Scripture." However, George says evangelicals Page 6

and Catholics should not "paper over" their differences in the interest of ecumenical accommodation. Continuing, he encourages evangelicals to embrace reformed theology, explaining that 16th century reformers like Martin Luther, John Calvin, and Thomas Cranmer had no desire to start a brand new church from scratch. "What they were interested in doing was reforming the Church -the one holy catholic and apostolic Church -- on the basis of the Word of God, [and] calling the Church back to its biblical roots and its evangelical faith," he says. "And I think that's what our challenge is today as well." George recently wrote a feature article for Christianity Today magazine, encouraging evangelicals and Protestants to lift up the Virgin Mary. He feels that Jesus' mother was a great example of Christian discipleship and obedience, who should be praised for her faithfulness. (AgapePress, 1/12/04)

#### **Clergy Abuse Numbers Grow**

A draft of the national survey of sex abuse claims against Roman Catholic priests reports that 4,450 clergy have been accused of molesting minors since 1950. The survey said 11.000 abuse claims have been filed during that period with 78 percent of the abused between the ages of 11 and 17. The number of accused clergy is already much greater than the scope of abuse previously estimated by victims' groups and the media. The bishops commissioned the unprecedented survey as part of a series of reforms meant to restore trust in their leadership. The report blames the sex abuse crisis on the bishops' failure to grasp the gravity of the problem, their misguided willingness to forgive and their emphasis on avoiding scandal, among other things. Victim advocates say the survey ultimately will underestimate the number of cases because it is based on selfreporting by bishops. (AP, 2/16/04)

#### **Cardinal OKs Condoms**

A Catholic cardinal, regarded as a successor to Pope John Paul II, apparently has diverted from standard church teaching by hinting that using a condom might not be sinful. Someone who has the HIV virus could use a condom to protect life, said Cardinal Godfried Daneels of Belgium. Some observers of the Catholic hierarchy believe he is being used to soften hostility brought by comments about condoms. Last year, the Vatican stirred international controversy with its claim the HIV virus can pass through condoms. A spokesman for a homosexual rights group, the Catholic Rainbow Sash movement, called the comments "terribly significant." "For Daneels to say something as clear as this shows it's not only a valid and responsible Catholic position to approve condoms in some circumstances, but that this is known at the highest level," said Michael Kelly. ## Non Catholics Are Going to Hell According to Gibson

Mel Gibson has come under fire for being hard on Jews in his film "The Passion of the Christ" - but apparently, he feels that Protestants are also doomed to damnation. In fact, it looks like Gibson, a conservative Catholic, believes that his Episcopalian wife could be going to hell. Gibson was interviewed by the Herald Sun in Australia, and the reporter asked the star if Protestants are denied eternal salvation. "There is no salvation for those outside the Church," Gibson replied. "I believe it." He elaborated: "Put it this way. My wife is a saint. She's a much better person than I am. Honestly. She's, like, Episcopalian, Church of England. She prays, she believes in God, she knows Jesus, she believes in that stuff. And it's just not fair if she doesn't make it, she's better than I am. 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
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
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

truly, really, and substantially contained" (CCC, 1374). The priest "reaches up into the heavens, brings Christ down from His throne, and places Him upon our altar to be offered up again as the Victim for the sins of man. It is a power greater than that of saints and angels. The priest speaks and lo! Christ, the eternal and omnipotent God, bows his head in humble obedience to the priest's command" writes Priest John O'Brien in his book, The Faith of Millions. The consecrated Eucharist is lifted up to be worshipped as the "Body of Christ." Yet Jesus said, "If anyone says to you, 'behold here is the Christ'...do not believe him for false Christs...will arise and will show great signs and wonders, so as to mislead, if possible, even the elect." (Mat. 24:23-24). As preposterous and unthinkable as this may sound, most Catholics believe Christ appears over 200,000 times each day on Catholic altars throughout the world.

#### Jesus is the Only Sinless Mediator

Paul unambiguously proclaimed there is only one who is qualified to be "the mediator between God and men" It is God's perfect man and man's perfect God - Christ Jesus our Lord (I Tim 2:5). Jesus said "unless you believe that I am *He*, you shall die in your sins" (John 8:24). The true Jesus is revealed in Scripture. He is the all-sufficient Savior who saves sinners completely and forever.
